SUMMER 2020

During the summer of 2020, BRAVE facilitated 2 classes, serving 31 students, with a focus on racial identity and social justice. Over the summer, we took an expeditionary learning approach to developing a strong sense of self. Using a social justice lens, Trailblazers were able to explore self-identity.

Our youngest Trailblazers explored the concept of self through our anchor text Blended by Sharon Draper. In Blended, students learned about a young girl, Isabella, who struggles to find herself within her mixed identity. This text allowed us to have deep discussions about race and racial identity. They also had the opportunity to bury some of their favorite self-identity assignments in a time capsule!

Our more mature Trailblazers explored race and self-identity through our anchor text Kindred by Octavia Butler. Through this text, Trailblazers explored identity mapping, racial violence, and developed a deeper understanding of our nation's dark history of chattel slavery through heart-felt courageous conversations.

In our summer programming, Trailblazers stretched their thinking and celebrated their own backgrounds and cultures.



PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT UNIT WRAP UP

As we wrap out this calendar year, we will be finishing our focus on Personal Development! Students have explored their

identities, values, personal brands and much more throughout our time together. We have gotten to know each other but most importantly, ourselves.

Silhouette Project:

Trailblazer students explored themselves and identified the many pieces that make them who they are, from race and gender, to hobbies and their personality traits. They then identified stereotypes that correspond with different elements of their identity. Students share what stereotypes they've heard and challenged.

Now that we've gotten well into our Personal Development unit, students will begin exploring how social injustice plays a role in their lives and the lives of people that identify similarly. Moving into the New Year, we will also begin our Social Justice unit. Throughout our Social Justice unit, Trailblazer students will need adults that they can have courageous conversations with as we tackle some harsh realities. We'll be talking more about this in Parent Workshops and/or "town hall" meetings.
